



Barbara A. Foley Quality, Safety and Injury Prevention Award

Description

This award recognizes a nurse who has developed, implemented or advocated for quality, safety and/or injury prevention initiatives that have resulted in improved outcomes in the emergency care setting, or at the local, state or national level.

Requirements

- Nominee must be an ENA member
- Two narrative statements from two different individuals addressing the three separate criteria listed below. At least one narrative must be written by an ENA member
- Curriculum vitae / Resume summary of the Nominee (please see the Achievement Awards Handbook for a list of specific information needed)

Narrative Statements / Criteria

Narrative statements should not include the name of the nominee.

Narrative statements should address each criterion listed below:

1. A description of how the nominee developed or promoted quality, safety or injury prevention initiatives in the emergency care setting or at the local, state or national level
2. A description of how the nominee actively participates in:
 - a) partnerships with local emergency care providers, law enforcement and/or community groups to promote quality or safety strategies or programs that have resulted in improved outcomes

OR

 - b) promotion of injury prevention efforts through structured programs as evidenced by documentation in the local media, state newsletters or chapter activities
3. A description of the nominee's advocacy efforts related to legislation, policy or regulatory enforcement that will prevent injuries and deaths or improve the delivery of safe care

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
