



Pediatric Readiness Improvement Award

Description

This award recognizes a nurse who has demonstrated outstanding efforts to improve readiness in caring for children in the emergency care setting.

Requirements

- Nominee must be an ENA member
- Two narrative statements written by two different individuals addressing the five separate criteria listed below. At least one narrative must be written by an ENA member
- Curriculum vitae / Resume summary of the Nominee (please see page 2 in the Achievement Awards Handbook for a list of specific information needed)

Narrative Statements / Criteria

Narrative statements should not include the name of the nominee.

Narrative statements should address each criterion listed below:

1. A description of how the nominee demonstrates collaboration with colleagues to improve pediatric readiness
2. A description of how the nominee demonstrates advocacy for pediatric patients through one or more of the following roles: pediatric emergency care coordinator (PECC), pediatric champion, mentor, preceptor, or resource / educator
3. A description of programs or initiatives the nominee has developed and/or implemented to promote prevention of injuries and deaths of children
4. A summary of the development or dissemination of education to nurses or the public on the importance of pediatric readiness in the emergency care setting
5. A description of the applicant's efforts to improve pediatric readiness in the emergency care setting as defined in the evidence-based, consensus [Guidelines for the Care of Children in the Emergency Department](#)

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
