- **Advanced Practice Procedural Skills Lab** — Review recorded presentations on the clinical indications, contraindications, and process for performing various procedures in the emergency care setting.
- **Antimicrobial Therapy for Abdominal Pathology** — Address length of treatment, dosage, and risk for complications when treating abdominal infections.
- **Bleeding and Female** — Review vaginal bleeding in the non-pregnant female. This course covers the potential causes of bleeding including coagulopathies, ovulatory and anovulatory menstrual cycles.
- **Identifying and Addressing Emergent Ear, Nose and Throat Conditions** — Taught in a series of patient scenarios, the attendee will be able to differentiate clinical findings and relate them back to the diagnosis and treatment.
- **Improving Medical Decision Making in Pediatrics: Diagnostic Imaging** — Designed to assist the APN in answering the questions of “what radiologic test to order and why” to assist in the clinical decision-making process.
- **Master the Ultrasound for: Central, Arterial & Peripheral Line Insertion** — Increase their overall knowledge of how to use the Ultrasound Machine discussing how it works, settings and probe selection.
- **Military Contributions to Life-Saving Civilian Trauma Care** — Understand the significant contributions the military has made to life-saving, civilian trauma care, including tactical care and damage control, plus new trauma concepts and ideas for civilian-military trauma collaboration.
- **Not That Crazy — Unusual but Effective Toxicology Interventions** — Discuss how things that sound more like a good meal than good medicine such as salt, fat, glycemic agents, alcohol and a methylene blue chaser may be great options for managing the sickest overdose patients.
- **Not your Average STEMI** — Focus on serial 12-lead ECGs and careful interpretation in light of symptoms and risk factors will be presented.
- **Oncologic Emergency Simulation** — View a guided case study that will be presented for each topic involving coagulopathies, acute febrile illness, electrolyte derangements, treatment complications, immunotherapies, and evaluation of new onset weakness.
- **Procedural Sedation and Analgesia** — Review several important aspects of sedation including: indications, preparation, medications, recovery and discharge criteria.
- **Radiology Basics: Interpretation Pearls for the Advanced Practice Nurse** — Discuss the basic process of x-ray interpretation including normal and abnormal findings and their correlation to various pathologies.
- **Special K: Dissociating Fact from Fiction** — See an overview of the mechanism of action for ketamine including its use for various indications including analgesia, a procedural sedation, and acute agitation.
- **The Eyes Have It: Assessing Ocular Changes in Acute Stroke** — Review normal visual pathways and eye function, in addition to providing helpful hints for quick, precise interpretation of the patient’s ocular symptoms.
- **The Good, the Bad and the Ugly-EKG’s (Advanced Arrhythmias)** — Learn to recognize abnormal tracings and gain skills in identifying supraventricular and ventricular rhythms, bundle branch blocks, hemiblocks, pericarditis, Brugada Syndrome, WPW and much more.
- **When the Trauma Becomes the Stroke Patient: Craniocervical Blunt Trauma** — Identify common mechanisms of injury and the pathophysiology as they relate to blunt trauma to the craniocervical region.
