

Emergency Nurses Needed for Handoff Study



Have you ever wondered what the nurse was thinking about while giving you patient handoff? Or why sometimes patient care reports go smoothly and sometimes they don't?

I am conducting a research study exploring the clinical judgement and influences on the handoff process of emergency nurses. You are invited to participate in this research study and share the invitation with other colleagues.

You must:

- Be a full-time registered nurse (RN)
- Working in an emergency department in the U.S.
- Practicing independently (off orientation) for a minimum of one year
- Have access to an electronic device (computer/laptop/phone) with a webcam and internet connection
- Consent to audio and video recording
- Read and speak English

Nurses who work as educators, managers, advanced practice nurses, in exclusively fast-track or non-urgent care settings, or in settings outside a hospital-based emergency department are not eligible to participate.

The interview will take place on Zoom® at a time of mutual convenience between the researcher and participant. The interview is anticipated to take 60 minutes over one session.
